CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

Conclusion

Based on the data presentation and data analysis in the chapter IV, finally the writer concluded that the answer of the formulation of the problem:

- 1. Students' reading comprehension in narrative text taught by using CPT technique was categorized into Excellent level. It can be seen from the frequency students' post test score who got 81-100 in experimental class is 16 students with the percentage 48.48% within the mean score is 80.60.
- 2. Students reading comprehension in narrative text taught without using CPT technique was categorized into Good level. It can be seen from the frequency students' post test score who got 61-80 in control class is 17 students with the percentage is 51.51 % within the mean score 64.54.
- 3. There was significant difference on students' reading comprehension taught by using CPT technique and taught without CPT technique. It can be seen from t-obtain=7.81 is bigger than t-table=1.667(at significant level 5 %) and t-table=2.381 (at significant level of 1 %).
- There was significant effect on students' reading comprehension taught by using CPT technique. Eta square was 0.487 its mean the effect size has large effect.

1. Suggestion for the English Teacher:

- It is recommended to English teachers to use Classwide Peer Tutoring a. technique as an alternative in teaching and learning process, especially in reading narrative text.
- In effort to increase the students' reading comprehension, Classwide Peer Tutoring technique can be one of the choices for the English teacher to help students' reading comprehensionespecially in narrative text.
- Teacher makes reading as habitual activities for students in the school.

2. Suggestion for the Students:

- The students should pay more attention to the lesson explained by the teacher.
- The students are also hoped to read as much as possible to increase their vocabulary in order to make a good comprehension on the text.
